



#### TATSFIFLD PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September together with 8 parishioners.

#### **PLANNING**

Application reference: TA/2024/870/TPO. 2 Beacon Shaw, Tatsfield Approach Road, Tatsfield TN16 2JT. T1) – Norway Spruce – section fell to as close to ground level as practicable. T2) – Common Horse Chestnut – section fell to as close to ground level as practicable. Summary: There is insufficient information to review this application on the Tandridge website – all that is uploaded is a red line plan and the application form. Recommendation: Request TDC to provide further information and reconsult/extend consultation, providing the following note: There is insufficient information to review this application on the Tandridge District Council planning website – all that is uploaded is a red line plan and the application form. The application form cross references 'supporting "reason for works" from "Treecraft Ltd" Arboriculturist provided within the description of works section and Structural report and photos from "CDR Engineering Services Ltd". These have yet to be uploaded for consultees to review. N.B since meeting further information has been received and a Recommendation of No Comment has been submitted.

Application reference: TA/2024/82. Charmwood (plot C), Greenway, Tatsfield TN16 2BS. Erection of a 2 storey dwelling (self-build). Summary: Planning permission has existed on this plot to construct a new build house since March 2019 (TDC ref. 2018/2481 and varied by 2021/1125). Evidently previous applications have now lapsed and a new application is being submitted. There is limited information and in our view there are a number of key documents and commitments that are not provided to enable a decision. Recommendation: Objection.Though the principle of a replacement dwelling has been previously set on this site under TDC planning applications ref. 2018/2481 and varied by 2021/1125, this new application should be reviewed in the context of the adoption of the Tatsfield Neighbourhood Plan 2024.

In design and massing terms, the proposed house is considered appropriate and proportionate, however, a number of key documents are missing, and commitments need to be shown before TDC make a decision on this application. A Design and Access Statement, Planning Statement and a Renewable Energy Statement should all have been submitted with an application for a new dwelling for consultees to review it properly. No commitment has been made to meet 10% renewable energy generation on site as required under TDC Core Strategy policy CSP14 (Sustainable Construction). The proposal is also not compliant with Policy TNP08B of the adopted Tatsfield Neighbourhood Plan for the provision of well-designed energy efficient developments which requires: New developments should demonstrate that they meet a high level of sustainable design and construction and will be optimised for energy efficiency, targeting zero carbon emissions. This includes:-

- a) Siting, orientation and shading of windows to optimise passive solar gain,
- b) The use of high quality, thermally efficient building materials,

- c) Installation of energy efficiency measures such as **high levels of insulation, triple glazing and heat recovery**.
- d) All new development should incorporate on-site energy generation from renewable sources such as solar panels.

We ask that this information is clearly demonstrated by the applicant and the commitments made for energy use and on site renewable energy generation such as solar roof panels.

Note on Planning Decision at committee for 2024/393: Lochiel, Ricketts Hill Road, Tatsfield TN16 2NB - Demolition of existing dwelling and erection of new dwelling. Planning was granted at TDC planning committee in the past week for this replacement dwelling which used three cumulative permitted development decisions to demonstrate that a new replacement dwelling that was 136% larger than the existing single storey bungalow was appropriate. Tatsfield Parish Council objected to this application on it being 'materially larger' than the existing bungalow (almost 2.5 times the size), causing harm in the Green Belt, on poor non-contextual design, no commitments to renewable energy and insufficient off street parking. This was repeated in our 3 minutes to the planning committee on the night including the numerous TDC and Neighbourhood Plan policies that it did not comply with.

Tandridge District Council cited 'Very Special Circumstances' to argue that the proposed house was a better option than building the three separate extensions to the current bungalow which they had also permitted in the past 2 years.

It is very unusual to use 'Very Special Circumstances' on a single residential application and our concerns about this setting a significant precedent for the future were set aside by the committee and a majority supported the application for approval.

**FINANCE** Items for expenditure were approved this involved works to the exterior paintwork at AMB, replacement and painting to the front beams and interior paintwork to new fire doors.

Mike Platten was appointed as the Internal Auditor for 2024-25 and is proposing an interim audit around Christmas and year end audit in May 2025.

**FURZE CORNER** Jason Syrett provided a report on progress of the initial meeting of the Steering Group for this project and Terms of Reference for the Steering Group were approved by the Parish Council. Please contact Jason Syrett if you are interested in joining this exciting project (<u>jasonsyrett@tatsfiedlpc.org.uk</u>).

**RISK ASSESSMENT** The Annual Parish Council Risk Assessment has been concluded and all matters arising addressed. Furze Corner will now be added for future Risk Assesment.

**EV CHARGING** Simon Cook reported that initial investigations and applications had been supplied to a contractor but would be 10 weeks before we would hear if we are considered.

**RECYCLING INITIATIVE** Kim Jennings has been looking into small recycling projects that could maybe be introduced for residents, this would involve recycling medicine foils and coffee pods.

**PARISH MAGAZINE EVENT** The PC received a request from Tatsfield Parish Magazine to use Westmore Green to hold an event on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May 2025; permission was granted.

**REMEMBRANCE SERVICE** This will take place on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> November at the Remembrance Stone at 10.40am. We require volunteers to assist with setting up and traffic management; if you can help please contact Kimjenning@tatsfieldpc.org.uk.

Hi. Back again. How has your summer been? I hope it has been enjoyable and you have taken advantage of all the events that have happened in Tatsfield recently, but more importantly in the future. See the middle pages for the events list.

Tandridge District Council have agreed new **corporate plan for 2024-2028** which sets out the Council's strategic direction for the next four years. The vision is to protect the environment, delivering affordable homes, encouraging economic growth and supporting a healthy and inclusive community. The priorities will be:

- Protecting and enhancing the environment Delivering affordable housing for local people - A thriving economy
- Financial prudence and sustainability Putting residents at the heart of what they do.
- A safe and healthy and caring community supporting those most in need.

Let's hope all of the above is achievable.

TDC's first **net zero carbon homes** have been built at Orrick Court Caterham on the Hill, these new affordable rented homes mark an important step towards reducing carbon emissions and promoting sustainable living.

In the **fight against illegal breaches** of planning control a High Court injunction has been secured for a site in Shipley Bridge who had been undermining the planning laws and the green belt by making hard surfaces for mobile accommodation on the land.

TDC have refreshed the website as part of the work to improve online services, hopefully making it easier for everyone to engage more securely but also efficiently.

Tatsfield residents are invited to meet the **Surrey Police and Crime Commissioner, Chief Constable and Tandridge Borough Commander** on Tuesday, October 29<sup>th</sup> between 6:30pm and 8pm at The Arc in Weston Drive Caterham. Attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions and raise concerns following presentations.

Each year, TDC check the details on the **Electoral Register** are correct, so everyone who is eligible to vote in elections can have their say. This is known as the **Annual Canvass.** Look out for your request and action it straight away please.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> October 2024 White Lane Titsey will be closed for the **annual Bec climb.** Please take note.

#### SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL

Utility companies, such as those providing water, gas, electricity, and internet services, sometimes need to dig up roads to repair or maintain the infrastructure beneath them. We collaborate closely with these utility companies to coordinate the work on our roads. Although these works may cause temporary road closures and detours, they are essential to ensuring the continued delivery of vital services.

In the event of an emergency, such as a burst water main, a gas leak, or a sudden loss of electricity or internet services, utility companies may need to begin repairs immediately. In these urgent cases, they are allowed to notify us within two hours of starting the work. Due to the urgency, we cannot refuse permits for these emergency repairs, but it can be challenging to organise them, especially when other roadworks are already underway nearby. Since January 2024, the Streetworks team have managed 21,418 emergency works across our road network.

While road closures can be inconvenient, they are a necessary part of maintaining the essential services we all depend on. We work closely with utility companies to ensure that these works are completed properly and safely.

#### **CLAIRE COUNTINHO MP**

After another busy month out and about in East Surrey meeting residents, I wanted to give a particular mention to two visits to the wonderful Woodhouse Centre in Oxted, and the Prospero Theatre in Caterham to hear about their brilliant Friday Club. I'm delighted to have supported both groups through my local charity the Friendship Project, which I started to help support community groups who tackle loneliness. Overall, the Prospero Theatre has received £2000 for their Sandwich Club and the Woodhouse Centre has received £2500 for refurbishment.

I also met with the headteachers of five independent schools to discuss their concerns around the plan to introduce VAT on independent school fees. More than 1,000 constituents responded to my survey with 98% agreeing that this would increase pressure on local state schools and services for children with special educational needs and disabilities. 87% of parents who responded who had a child in an independent school said they would have to consider sending their child to a state school. That's up to 900 parents of children that local state schools would have to accommodate, many of whom have complex special needs. My fellow Surrey MPs and I have written to the Chancellor of the Exchequer, Rachel Reeves to ask her to reconsider this damaging policy and introduce an immediate exemption for children attending independent special schools.

In my role as Shadow Secretary of State, I led the opposition to Ed Miliband's plans to create an energy company that doesn't generate any energy, that won't save families

money off their bills and cannot be guaranteed to turn a profit. You can watch my full speech on YouTube or my website.

I have also campaigned against the Government's plan to scrap the Winter Fuel Payment with no time for those affected to prepare. 17,000 pensioners in East Surrey will lose up to £300 of energy bill support this winter - including 84% of pensioners living in poverty across the country. However, despite our best efforts in Parliament, the Government is determined to go ahead with this policy. I will be launching another pension credit campaign this winter just as I did in 2022; if you know anyone who is affected please do encourage them to check their eligibility and call 0800 99 1234. This is a separate payment from your state pension and could top up your weekly income by £182.60 per week if you live alone or £278.70 per week for pensioners living with a partner. I know many will be just above the cut-off line and for them I worry this will be a very difficult winter. If the Government truly wanted to means test the Winter Fuel Payment then this could have done in many better ways and with more notice.

Finally, I know some of you may be interested in the Conservative leadership election. It was a difficult election for my party. Many of you discussed your thoughts with me during that time. After much consideration, I have decided to support Kemi Badenoch. She has a fresh approach to politics, she is courageous, an engineer by background and firmly rooted to her Conservative principles.

**How does it work?** You must live in Surrey and journeys should start and or end in Surrey. Once you've received your card, simply scan the card at the ticket machine. If you're purchasing a ticket on the bus, simply hold the LINK card to the ticket machine and tell the driver where you're going. The card is valid 24/7 all year

#### TATSFIELD MARTIAL ARTS - A NEW JUDO BLACK BELT AT TMA!

On Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> September, I had the absolute pleasure of presenting Bella Mumford with her 1<sup>st</sup> Dan black belt on behalf of the British Judo Association. This promotion is extra special for the club, as Bella becomes our first female black belt in judo and at the tender age of 15, she is now our youngest black belt. Bella has been with the club almost since we first opened. She joined as a complete beginner along with her older brother, Aaron, in 2015. In the 9 years she has trained with us, she has represented the club at competitions on numerous occasions, has fought in the Surrey Team and has been county champion.



A black belt in a lot of martial arts is gained when you can demonstrate the required level of skill and knowledge - however. Judo is one of the few martial arts where you have to fight and win in order to collect 'black belt points'. When you have 100 points, providing you have also passed the technical examination, you promoted to black belt. Bella went to the London Area 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday grading on September knowing that two more wins would give her the remaining points she required, and she delivered!

At TMA, 30% of our junior headcount are female which is a much higher ratio compared to other judo clubs. Bella helps coach the Thursday night junior class and I really hope the girls in this class get inspired by what she has achieved. The club is 10 years old in January and this year has been particular rewarding, as we have seen three of our teenage members gain their competitive black belts – just shows what hard work and determination can do!

The huge piles of branches that were cut down during the Pfizer visit in July were all well wilted and burnt easily on the bonfire. Flower beds were weeded and tidied, paths that hadn't had their edges trimmed for several years were also dug back, shrubs were trimmed and the grass was cut. Work was also carried out in the compost area. A reminder that there are bags of compost there freely available for collection. Due to the organ recital and Harvest Lunch our October maintenance session was held on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> September.

#### THE TATSFIFLD GARDENER IN OCTOBER

As I write (mid September) we have already had a couple of very chilly mornings with a slight ground frost in the hollows, this is about a month early! I was talking to an old work colleague a few weeks ago and we agreed that maybe it is time to throw away all those lovely gardening books full of advice and growing plans, with sowing\growing dates of course! Our changing climate is now so unpredictable, it is difficult to know what to do and when! The old rule to make sure you have taken your geranium cuttings by early September no longer applies; last year I took geranium and fuchsia cuttings in October and they did very well – BUT – will October be so mild this year, who knows!



A single geranium or fuchsia plant can yield ten times its numbers by taking cuttings, it is a simple process and great fun to see all those 'free' plants for planting next year. Gardeners like to take two types of cuttings; the normal tip cutting where the cut is made just below a leaf joint (shown on the right of the pic), or taking 'slips', also known as taking with a 'heel', that is taking your cutting with a tiny piece of the older wood it was attached to (shown on the left of the pic). The thinking is that taking a cutting with a tiny 'heel' of more mature wood gives a higher percentage of successful cuttings, go on give it a try!

I have decided that this year I am going to leave my tender perennials outside in a sunny spot until I am sure the weather has cooled down and the frosts have arrived. However, I do not want them to keep growing and flowering so there is another challenge to protect them from rain to keep the soil on the dry side. I will have to invent some means to do this as my Brugmansias are now nearly five feet tall!

My annual flowers, cornflower, cottage marigold and the shoo fly plant (Nicandra physalloides) have done very well in the borders this year. Before pulling them up I will cut off all the flower heads, place them in a paper bag (you can mix them up), leave them in a dry, warm place, giving them a good shake every now and then. I will keep them in a drawer over winter and then sow them in March (or maybe later — climate change again!!) in a seed tray with no heat; I will put them outside as soon as the winter frosts are gone (who knows when that will be!), and then plant them out in April — ish. You could also sow them direct into your garden borders as soon as the soil conditions are suitable (dry on the surface) scattering them thinly and raking over gently. Most annual flowers are loved by pollinating insects, so having these lovely plants growing amongst your perennials and shrubs will make your garden much more attractive to wildlife.

It used to be the tradition to cut down all herbaceous perennial plants at the end of the month to 'tidy up' a border; but we now understand how important these flower heads are to seed eating birds. Please leave them until later in the year; I know they will look a bit scruffy but just think, you are helping our local bird population to survive the winter months. **Jon Allbutt** 

#### OCTOBER WILDLIFF GARDENING TIPS – BONFIRES AND WOODPILES

Perhaps most importantly, bonfire season is upon us with Guy Fawkes and Halloween so please, please check your bonfire for hedgehogs as these little guys love to sleep under a big comfy woodpile so they often get burnt if the fire gets lit without a thorough check.

In October hedgehogs will be settling down to hibernate but youngsters won't be big enough to sleep through winter so it's a good time to be putting out cat biscuits to help see them through. And one thing that's really helpful to hedgehogs and oodles of other wildlife through the colder months is a woodpile. A woodpile can be a lifesaver for many of our winter birds because it is also a haven where worms, bugs, and bees can thrive and survive the cold weather. Many of these mini-beasts live underground but if the ground gets waterlogged, a woodpile might be the only high ground where they can seek refuge. A few of them might get picked off by a hungry robin or hedgehog but the odds are so much better than staying underground. Woodpiles are also great sources of food for the tiniest creatures that like to eat the wood itself, so there's something for everyone – they really are one of nature's favourite larders. And so easy to make too; it is just a pile of wood that's preferably still got its bark on, and nothing that's ever been painted or treated. And if you feel like turbo-charging it into a natural habitat you can add some partly rotted wood that already has some lichen or fungus on it to get the food-chain started. If anyone is wondering how big a woodpile should be; as with many healthy things in life; anything is good, but more is better.

All of which takes us back to bonfire night. Hedgehogs love a woodpile so much they often sleep in them so they can be near a nighttime snack. So please remember to check before lighting it.

**Interesting fact of the month...**I think I've been a bit slow on this one, but I've only just found out that badgers love root vegetables. We've always fed them with peanuts and



cat biscuits, and one of our stripey faced friends gets very excited about a half banana. But now we've tried carrots, it seems they are the go-to snack that might just keep them away from digging up the tulips. Fingers crossed... And I wonder if carrots help them see in the dark?

The concert will start with Hummel's 'Premier' Overture. Hummel was a contemporary of Beethoven, and wrote in much the same style. Very popular in his time, he was one of the most celebrated pianists in Europe, for both performing and teaching. The 'Premier' Overture is one of his lesser known works, but is extremely tuneful. This will be followed by Saint-Saens Cello Concerto No 1, played by Mariatu Kanneh-Mason, the youngest of seven siblings of this incredibly talented family, all of whom play at least two instruments to an exceptionally high standard. Many of you will recall Sheku's performance at the Royal wedding, and all indications show that his sister Mariatu is destined for similar levels of success, so we are thrilled that she has agreed to perform with NDS. Those in attendance will be able to say "We heard her in Tatsfield first!" in the years to come!

After the interval, the orchestra will play Beethoven's mighty Symphony No 7, the so-called 'Dance' symphony. Despite being composed when he was almost deaf, it remains one of the best-loved symphonies in the classical repertoire.

#### THE NIGHT SKY IN TATSFIFLD – OCTOBER 2024

In the solar system, as in the wider universe, not much moves in a perfect circle. The orbits of the Moon around the Earth and the planets and other objects around the Sun are all ellipses. In some cases, these are almost circular but in others they are extremely elliptical. Comets are a prime example of bodies that move in orbits far removed from circles. Closer to home, the Moon moves around us on an elliptical path whilst at the same time we move elliptically around the Sun. The result of this is that the distances between the three bodies is constantly changing. We can see this for ourselves in the way the size of the Moon varies which occasionally provides us with a "supermoon". This is something that is seriously overhyped by the media and possibly indicates a "not much news day". Any casual observer who glances at the full Moon on such an occasion won't immediately be struck by its suddenly engrossed proportions.

Because the Moon has to be opposite the Sun to appear full, it follows that at such a time, the Moon is rising as the Sun is setting so the rising full Moon is always seen at a comparatively sensible hour. It is a well-known phenomenon that a full Moon always looks larger when it is seen rising against other foreground objects such as trees and buildings even when it isn't a supermoon. If you watch the Moon rising and the look again several hours later you will see that, miraculously, it has reverted to its regular size. It's entirely likely that if the full Moon were to rise at 3am then the term supermoon would never have come into existence.

Of course, the supermoon does appear larger but not by very much. If we go back to thinking about elliptical orbits, then when the Moon is at perigee (closest to Earth) it is around 7% larger than average and when it is at apogee (furthest from Earth) it is 7% smaller than average. It is also brighter when it appears larger but only because there is (apparently) more surface area to reflect the sunlight onto the Earth.

Another example of an elliptical orbit can be seen on 2<sup>nd</sup> October when the southern tip of South America experiences an eclipse of the Sun. In most total solar eclipses, the Sun's light is blotted out completely which allows us to observe the corona, the Sun's outer atmosphere which is normally invisible to us. However, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of this month, the Moon will be slightly more distant from the Earth with the result that it appears smaller and in fact not large enough to obscure all of the Sun. The result is what astronomers call an "annular" eclipse because a ring (annulus) of sunlight remains visible even when the Moon is centrally located in front of the Sun. If you would like to witness the event there are always live feeds on the internet if you do a search. The eclipse begins at 5:50pm and finishes at 9:39pm BST.

For planetary observers, the evening sky is an improving picture with Mars rising at 11pm, Jupiter at 9.30pm and Saturn at 6pm on the 1<sup>st</sup> October. If you look at the map for September, the planets are in virtually the same positions although Mars is slightly further east (left). Just be aware that although the relationship of the planets to the stars is very similar the sky has rotated a little towards the west.

Venus is still very low down in the SW (just 8° high) at sunset around the middle of October. Please wait until the Sun has set before searching for it with any optical aid to avoid any damage to your eyes. **Brian Mills FRAS**

Bandstands: Their History, Decline and Revival by Paul Rabbitts.

#### NIGEL'S NATURE NOTES

For months on end the stars of the show were birds, but recently a fine selection of insects and plants have been forcing their way into the limelight. And here we go again with a collection of insect news, beginning with this from Steve (Gaskell) (28.06.24):

'Hi Nigel, look what I bred from a chrysalis I found in the soil while gardening. Makes up for not seeing too many butterflies this summer.'

WOW! A gorgeous-looking **Elephant hawk-moth**. What a beauty! Thanks for the update, Steve. Your breeding activity reminds me of the Small tortoiseshell chrysalises I used to 'rescue', many



years ago, when Mum was out weeding the garden beds. Even when placed in what I thought was a safe environment they would nearly always be attacked by predators. You obviously took much greater care of yours. Great job!

These moths in maturity, like most others, are seldom seen during daylight. In caterpillar form, however, they are quite often found and, due to their size, can be quite alarming! My neighbour (Val Moore) was surprised to find one on her patio, munching the leaves of a potted fuchsia. And Val wasn't the only one. Soon after, this email arrived from Gillian Phillips (12.09.24):



'Eek! I was enjoying the autumn sun on the patio today when this monster caught my eye. Luckily it was the other side of my glass balustrade, in a fuchsia bush. I managed to take one of the photos next to a steel measure to demonstrate its proportions. [About 3½ inches.] Should I be worried?'

Although somewhat scary, these large caterpillars are perfectly harmless to

humans. But as both you and Val have discovered, they love fuchsias. It will soon become a chrysalis in the soil close to your plant and emerge next year as a beautiful pink moth, among the prettiest in Britain. You're lucky to have such a visitor. I wish I had a few on my fuchsias. A worthy sacrifice, Gillian!

There are several species of hawk-moth to be found around the country. Some take the name of the plant on which they lay their eggs — Privet, Lime, Poplar, Spurge, Bedstraw and Convolvulus. I can't recall any reports of these locally; until now. Mary (Smith) sent this message (14.08.24):

This caterpillar was seen on the bark of the Birch tree in my front garden

just now - a **Lime hawk-moth**. I don't know how common they are but this is certainly a first for me. I identified it from my 'Oxford Book of Insects' and then looked up "bug" on my phone which gave the same result.'

What an excellent find, Mary. With so many Lime trees around the village I wonder how many other caterpillars



are lurking amongst the leaves. Unfortunately (for us), the fully formed moths are very well camouflaged, resembling the bark of the tree on which they rest. Finding one requires a lot of patience and a lot of luck. So, happy hunting, Mary!

Unfortunately, Martin Allen's caterpillars have proved more troublesome than most (09.08.24):

'Haven't got a 'before' picture but take it from me, my trough of nasturtiums looked amazing only two days ago. The 'after' picture is a disaster. But as I have said before, we need caterpillars as well, just not in our garden!'

These look like the caterpillars of the **Large white** butterfly, Martin. It's been a good year for them, partly thanks to you and your delicious nasturtiums!

And finally, some news of my own. You may recall how pleased I was to have such fine specimens of Aaron's rod

growing through my patio slabs. Well, soon afterwards, they were munched back to bare



stalks by a swarm of voracious caterpillars! Like Martin, I had daily visits from both Large and Small white butterflies. Were they the culprits? As it turned out – no; these were the caterpillars of the **Mullein moth**. Was this as worthy a sacrifice as Val and Gillian's? Absolutely. The caterpillars soon disappeared to pupate in some hidden place and my Aaron's rod quickly restored itself, throwing up a mass of new growth. All is well in the

semi-naturalist's garden.

### TATSFIELD HISTORY PROJECT

#### **TATSFIELD in 1924**


Last month, under the theme of 'how things have changed' I mentioned the call for a sewage cart to be provided for the village in the days before mains drainage. Little did I know then that, in

the same edition, Councillor Martin Allen would be reporting that 2024 Tandridge was now abandoning its predecessor's response to that century-old call and ending its Cesspool-Emptying Service.

There's a similar 'coming and going' aspect this month. In October 1924, the Westerham Herald was reporting on the increasing demand on the country's expanding telephone network with news of plans for a telephone exchange at Warlingham. This was likely to improve the service to Tatsfield and its neighbours. A hundred years later, we're hearing about the 'Digital Switchover' replacing that 100-year-old technology, getting rid of the copper wires and revolutionising the network.

Not many a week goes by without a mention of **speeding traffic** cropping up on Tatsfield Talk, but the issue had already come up as long ago as at the parish council meeting in October 1924. There had apparently been two accidents near the school, which was then near the junction of Ship Hill and Church Hill. A call came for the existing speed limit to be enforced properly to ensure that traffic kept to no more than **ten miles an hour** near the school.

At the same meeting, the need for more **housing** was raised. The rural district council had asked for suggestions about available land and the number of possible tenants. The parish council suggested that land could be made available behind the Village Hall. In the event, the main area for development became both sides of Lusted Hall Lane.



Also in October 1924 one item in the Bromley Mercury contained an odd and, so far, unexplained reference to Tatsfield. The Bromley Trades and Labour Council had complained to Farnborough Parish Council about the lack of a proper playground at their local boys' School. When the parish

council met, members described the Trades Council as "nosey parkers" and "ignominious". The chairman's attack on the Trades Council ended with "the only place for the Trades Council is the heights of Tatsfield where they can go and enjoy themselves without disturbing other people". What should we make of that?

And a reminder: 'History Weekend' at the Aileen McHugo Building – 23<sup>rd</sup>/24<sup>th</sup> November.
