





The Parish Council met on Monday 15th October.

I am happy to announce that Sue Dowse has been co-opted as a Parish Councillor at our October meeting. Welcome to the team Sue.

#### **Planning**

**TA/2024/437** 1 Park Farm Cottages, Rag Hill. Erection of a two storey rear extension, loft conversion and extension involving installation of 3 rooflights and erection of rear dormer. Erection of an outbuilding (Certificate of lawfulness for a proposed Use or Development). Recommendation: Objection consistent with our previous objection on application ref:TA/2024/95.

**TA/2023/101** Motorway service area North, Clacket Lane. Construction of a drive through lane and the associated civils works with extensions to provide the pay and collect locations (Updated plans and revised ecology Report). Recommendation: No further comment.

**TA/2024/939** The Briars, Ninehams Road. Conversion of existing double garage into a habitable room and erection of rear external access ramp. Recommendation: No Comment.

**TA/2024/1011** The Firs, Maesmaur Road. Erection of a detatched garage. Recommendation: No Comment.

**TA/2024/944/NC** Meadow Bank, Goatsfield Road. Conversion of agricultural building into a residential dwelling (Prior approval Schedule 2,Part 3, Class Q). Recommendation: No Comment.

**Finance** Expenditure was authorised for works on outside of the Village Hall and Aileen Mchugo Building. A quote for our three-yearly tree survey had been received and was approved by councillors this will take place in next few weeks. The external audit had passed with no comment. This can be viewed in full on our website)

**EV Charging points for Village** Simon Cook reported that he now had all relevant information and would proceed with an application.

**New Recycling Initative** The PC are planning to trial recycling of **foil medication containers** and **coffee pods**. More information to follow.

**Halloween Happening** The Roseheath Foundation requested to use the picnic benches outside the shops to provide Tricks and Treats for our village young ones (below 11yrs). This will take place between 4.30-6pm on 31<sup>st</sup> October. Permission approved by the PC.

**Christmas Tree** Once again we will have a large Christmas Tree in the village. This year it is a joint sponsorship by Tatsfield Aquatics and The Roseheath Foundation. It will be erected ready for switch-on of lights 1<sup>st</sup> December. The trees will be lit up again this year and we get so many comments about how wonderful our village looks. Of course this comes at a cost and I would like to ask if anyone would like to make a donation to our Lights Fund please contact me for further information.

**Aileen Mchugo Building Letting of Meeting Room** A review of the meeting room hire process resulted with the decision being made to charge village groups who hire the room to pay £10 per evening session. This charge is necessary to cover heating and cleaning costs. It was also agreed that AGM's of groups would remain free of charge.

#### TANDRIDGE DISTRICT COUNCIL

It has been a quiet month for me in September, although only shadowing my Independent colleagues at committee I do tend to support them and have my say on things that I believe are not correct. I attended the Licensing meeting that discussed the new guidelines over Pavement Licensing, who knew that was a thing? It was introduced during Covid to help businesses the government has extended the practice to help businesses continue with the practice of outdoor eating and drinking.

As always this time of year the budget process has started and we are now charged with findings more savings over the next four years of £4m. This will have an inevitable strain on the services offered so watch this space.

I had a promising conversation with a SCC Highways Officer that has resulted in an open channel to them in the future to discuss planning matters in areas of danger on our narrow and bendy roads.

Now that the Independent group consists of five members it was felt sensible between us to have more regular meetings so that we can discuss ideas and share experiences of things that are happening across our wards and may help each other resolve them quicker. The meetings will be bi-monthly and will be between our meetings with the Chief Executive and selected officers.

**Popular on-demand bus service now available across Surrey** On-demand buses are now available in East, Central, North and Southwest Surrey to help more residents get around the county, at a time that suits them. Rather than being restricted by traditional bus timetables, the accessible mini buses are available for travel for everyone, when they are needed. Buses also operate out of the areas to enable residents to access other key locations including town centres, supermarkets and train stations. The expansion of bus provision follows the success of services introduced last year in the Mole Valley, Tandridge, Farnham, Cranleigh, West Guildford and Longcross areas.

Surrey Connect is funded by Surrey County Council to help improve access to sustainable travel. To date, Surrey Connect buses have transported over 84, 000 passengers around the county. Buses run Monday to Friday from 7am to 7pm and on Saturdays from 8am to 6pm. Journeys can be booked with 30 minutes notice or up to 7 days in advance. Fares are charged based on how many miles are travelled starting from £2 for adults. Journeys can be booked:

What is vehicle crime, and why should it be taken seriously? Vehicle crime includes theft of vehicles, theft from vehicles, interference with a motor vehicle, and buying or selling stolen vehicles. These types of offences are increasingly being seen across the country. They are carried out at all hours of the day, even in broad daylight.

We want to help you stay safe and minimise the chances of becoming a victim of vehicle crime. There are simple steps you can take to deter criminals, such as making sure your vehicle is locked when you leave it, even if you are returning shortly. If you are a motorbike or moped owner, you can help keep them safe by using a disk lock, chaining your bike to an immovable object, and covering it when not in use.

- Storing keys away from windows and doors and in a metal tin
- If you are able to purchase one, use a radio frequency blocking pouch
- Consider using a steering lock
- Park in well-lit or CCTV covered areas

As we approach winter, you might have seen me and my staff out and about in East Surrey delivering posters to local services and pinning them up on parish council notice boards. That is because I have restarted my campaign to get the word out on how to apply for pension credit. Many pensioners are not aware that if you are in receipt of Pension Credit, you will also receive Winter Fuel Support, a free TV licence, a Warm Home Discount, and much more. Please check your eligibility or ask a friend or family member to help you check whether you can access this critical support. To apply for Pension Credit, all you need is your National Insurance number, your Bank details, and information about your savings. To check if you are eligible please call 0800 99 1234, or apply onlinewww.gov.uk/pension-credit.

I want to thank Inspector Lindsey Whatley, the Borough Commander for East Surrey, for taking the time to meet with me recently to discuss residents' concerns including worries about anti-social behaviour, traffic control measures, and traveller sites. Whilst being updated on the relocation of the police headquarters, I told the inspector that keeping the front desk service at Caterham was very important to people in the town.

After the shoplifting roundtable a few months ago, I was pleased to hear the parish council's work to install CCTV cameras in Oxted was having such a positive impact. I'm also grateful to the officers who have done so much to tackle multiple criminal gangs who were shoplifting on our high streets. There is still more to do, but our fantastic police officers are making good progress.

#### CITIZENS ADVICE EDENBRIDGE & WESTERHAM

A major change to this year's Winter Fuel Payment means that to get the allowance that's worth up to £300, you must also receive Pension Credit. If you don't currently get Pension Credit, but think you could be eligible, it's vital to check now and apply, otherwise you could miss out.

Pension Credit tops up pension incomes and can help with day to day living costs. If you are over State Pension age, you may be eligible to claim Pension Credit, even if you own your own home or have savings. People who claim Pension Credit may also be able to get:

- The Winter Fuel Payment and other help with heating costs
- Help with rent and Council Tax
- A free TV licence for those aged 75 or over
- Help with the costs of NHS services, such as NHS dental treatment, glasses and transport costs for hospital appointments.

You could be eligible for Pension Credit if your weekly income is below £218.15 or, if you have a partner who lives with you, £332.95. Qualifying income level may be higher in some circumstances, for example, if you receive a disability benefit.

Check your eligibility at gov.uk/pension-credit or by calling the Pension Service on 0800 99 1234.

DON'T DELAY !!! - to qualify for the Winter Fuel Payment this year, you must have been eligible for Pension Credit during the 'qualifying week' of 16 to 22 September. Since Pension Credit can be backdated by three months, the last date you can make a claim for Pension Credit and still get the Winter Fuel Payment is 21 December 2024.

It takes between six and eight weeks to process new Pension Credit claims, due to high volumes of applications. But as long as you apply by 21 December, and your claim is successful, you will get the Winter Fuel Payment.




Boom Arts Academy also teach a dance class to our children every Wednesday afternoon which incorporates some nursery rhymes here too.



#### THE FUTURE OF TATSFIELD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY (THS) - UPDATE

The THS Committee met in October to discuss our future. We are faced with a stark choice – bring forward a resolution at our AGM on the 26<sup>th</sup> November for the dissolution of the society – or hold off that action in the hope that we can attract more volunteers to join the committee. In the discussions that followed we considered what changes we could in the future, these are summarised below:

- Change the name of the society e.g. The Tatsfield Gardening Club to make it more appealing, less exclusive.
- Change the format of our shows, reduce (but not remove) the competitive element and be more diverse, maybe involve other groups, maybe support a return of the village fete/show on Westmore Green.
- Consider seeking sponsorship from a local business to help with costs.
- Instead of having an auction of produce at the end of a show, have produce labelled for sale, offer tables for others to offer their produce for sale.
- Change our rules to make entering some of the show classes easier to enter.
- Increase our visibility by wearing ID tags and maybe clothing like the TIB team.
- Increase our efforts to engage with our local school and pre-schools to encourage more awareness of the natural world and gardening, help with organising projects, maybe bring back our Giant Sunflower competition.
- Promote new initiatives in the community to make gardens more sustainable e.g. establishing meadows and other wildlife habitats, making and positioning bird boxes, insect hotels and refuges for other species.
- Improve and increase our presence on social media.

These are very ambitious aims, it was agreed that we must have more committee members if we are to survive and move forward.

#### TATSFIFLD MARTIAL ARTS - MORE MEDAL SUCCESS FOR TMA!

On Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September, the English Closed Judo Championship took place in Thetford, Norfolk. This event is the pinnacle event for English Judo – with the gold medallists taking the title of English Champion. Only the British Closed Championship in December is seen as a higher event within the domestic calendar.

TMA had one club member taking part, Kayden Plinston, in the male cadet (U17) U66kg category. Last year Kayden placed 7<sup>th</sup> in the U60kg category so we were hoping to improve on this. Kayden had been managing his weight closely leading up to the



competition, two weeks before he was weighing 69kg but he managed to get down to 65.5kg through hard training, diet and discipline – however, this is likely to be his last time competing at U66kg and a move into the U73kg category will be round the corner. It turned out that the U66kg group was massive, with 21 competitors entered – almost twice the size of the U73kg group!

The group with split into two pools. Kayden fought his way through to the final of his pool, winning all his contests inside the distance with ippon. In the final he came up against a very negative

player and eventually Kayden got caught in an armlock after trying to force the win. This meant that Kayden would go straight into one of the bronze medal fights against the winner of the repechage (everyone who loses a fight goes into the repechage pool, where they fight each other until there is a pool winner – once you lose two contests you are out of the competition completely). In judo, you must win the bronze medal, it's not a case of losing a fight and being given a bronze medal. If you lose the contest, you get awarded 5<sup>th</sup> place, which no one wants.

Kayden was up against a very difficult opponent, but someone he had beaten before. Kayden took the lead quite early on with a score that the referee originally gave ippon (a winning score) but the two side judges overruled to a waza ari (half score), so after initially celebrating what he thought was a win he had to switch back on and continue fighting. The contest became very close and both boys were giving it their all. With fifteen seconds left on the clock I was shouting at Kayden to keep away and not to risk getting caught as his opponent was getting more and more frantic knowing time was ticking away, but then with just one second left on the clock Kayden turned in for a throw and dumped him for an ippon score!

So, four wins and only one loss with all the wins coming via ippon and no fight going the distance. Not only did Kayden win the bronze medal in the English Championship, he has also secured his place on the EDS (England Development Squad) which will open the door to bigger events and the possibility of competing on the continent. Next up, he has the Surrey Open in October, which he won last year – however, this will be his first competition in the heavier weight group. Then, we are looking forward to the British Championships in December.

On Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> October the Surrey Open Championship took place at Donyngs Sport Centre in Redhill. TMA entered three competitors.

In the U57kg pre-cadet (U14) girls, Jane Mullings secured a silver medal with some aggressive, attacking judo and should be very proud of herself.

In the U66kg cadet boys, we had two competitors — Harvey Davy and Kayden Plinston. Harvey lost his first contest due to an armlock. Despite this armlock causing some damage which required medical assistance, Harvey fought on and won his next contest and this time it was Harvey applying the armlock and his opponent submitting as a result. Harvey's next fight was for a bronze medal against a tough opponent, who caught Harvey with a throw which scored ippon. So, a creditable fifth place for Harvey. Kayden, full of confidence after his England selection, had three contests and despatched all his opponents with big throws which all scored ippon. Kayden took a combined mat time of one minute and 57 seconds to win all his contests along with the gold medal. Considering a judo contest time is four minutes, finishing three contests in less than half this time is impressive and highlights the step-up in class between national standard judoka and decent county level players.

#### THS - GARDEN CLUB

At our last Garden Club meeting we welcomed Marie Shallcross to give us a talk on planting up and tips on growing daffodils, for our gardens, in pots on the patio and of course up to 12" pots for our Spring Show.

The daffodil bulbs are full of starch which gives the bulb energy. It is the green leaves that put energy back into the bulb for the following season so extra feed is not required-

just don't cut off the leaves after flowering too soon! There are 40 species of daffodils and these are sub divided into over 200 varieties. There is a daffodil for everyone, tall

and short. Did you know that the bulbs will outlive you? In the spring I went on a daffodil tour at Hever Castle with Johnny Walker, and he showed us daffodils that had been planted in Anne Boleyn's time. They had been buried under the earth for hundreds of years, but when the gardeners dug and cleared a path through the Orchard area they appeared. They are absolutely stunning but sadly unavailable to buy right now.

Marie spent time on talking about soil mixes. She suggested two parts top soil, two parts peat free multi-purpose compost and one part grit. Give this a good mix and then pot up your bulbs, pointy end up. This mix is free draining so the bulbs don't rot. It is a good idea to wear plastic gloves as daffodil bulbs can give you a skin irritant. You can then top dress your pots with grit if you so wish. This helps to stop squirrels burying their acorns and nuts. The grit also keeps the foliage clean in wet weather.

If you are planting up pots for the patio there is no reason why you can't add a potted Cyclamen or three, or maybe a Heuchera, to add interest. These can be removed when the leaves begin to grow through and planted in the borders.

Marie had bagged up four different varieties of daffodils for us to take home and plant up ready for the Spring Show. Refreshments of teas and coffees were enjoyed by all, together with Sue's Homemade Lemon Drizzle cake.

Marie has a Blog called 'Plews Potting Shed', and is a garden designer and consultant, gardening teacher and writer. We were all lucky to have her.

#### THE TATSFIELD GARDENER IN NOVEMBER

I hear stories that an aurora event followed by a frost and then a sunny day being an omen for the weather this winter; nice idea but definitely not supported by science, or even weather records! That said, our weather continues to keep us on our gardening toes. I am very keen to see how the weather is going to influence our autumn colour. By the end of October my Hamamelis was showing some intense red colours (mostly yellow last year) and so is my neighbour's Liquidambar tree. Colour at this time of the year is precious and is the grand finale to a summer of colour. Make sure to look around your local gardens and identify which plants give a good autumn display on our clay soil before you buy.

It may be the end of our summer flowering season, but for veggie gardeners this is the beginning of preparation for next year's crops. Tatsfield's clay soil needs attention now to be at its best for cultivation next spring. As soon as your plot is cleared dig it over roughly and leave it for frost action – that is if we get any frost this winter! Sort out your cropping plan and cover the area reserved for peas, beans, salads, potatoes with well-rotted manure (avoid fresh stable manure as it is full of grass seed) or compost like our excellent Tatsfield black gold (composting site is now closed for the winter). Root crops and brassicas prefer to grow in soil that was manured the previous year. If you are new to growing your own produce and need help, the best guides are available at the Wisley Gardens bookshop or online at <a href="https://www.rhs.org.uk">www.rhs.org.uk</a>

If you are going to make changes in the garden, and are planning to plant trees and shrubs, now is the best time to do it while there is still some warmth, and plenty of moisture, in the soil. In these conditions plants will make new roots and be better able to grow with less watering next year. When planting make sure to dig a hole larger than you need to make room for a generous amount of compost underneath and around the root ball. The compost acts as a sponge to hold water during dry periods; when you have completed the planting add a generous layer of compost as a mulch over the surface of the soil.

November is also the time to plant spring flowering bulbs in the garden. Buy and plant groups of at least ten bulbs for the best display. As a guide, bulbs should be planted to twice their depth, the packaging should give more specific instructions; remember that bulbs planted too near the surface will not be able to support the leaves and flower heads. A lovely feature in a garden meadow is to plant the beautiful native Daffodil (Narcissus pseudonarcissus). Planting into grass is very easy, take a spade and cut into the grass at an angle, lever up the grass and place a couple of bulbs underneath, withdraw the spade and stand firmly on the grass to push it back into place. Repeat this in a random pattern about six inches apart using at least 20 bulbs, the more you use the better the display. As the bulbs mature, they will produce more bulbs until you have a dense group (or drift) and a spectacular display.

#### WILDLIFF GARDENING TIPS FOR NOVEMBER

What a beautiful though chilly time of year! The evenings are drawing in, although that's not a problem for most of our wildlife because more than two thirds of animal species are nocturnal and they need the dark to live, thrive and survive. This leads me to the subject of light pollution now that the clocks have gone back and dusk is so much earlier. Unlike most animals, humans have pretty awful night vision, and we need plenty of artificial light to help us see in the dark, and quite often we leave the light on even after we've wandered off and don't need it anymore. The trouble is that when the light is outdoors, it scares off all those lovely nocturnal creatures that are doing their best to scratch a living out there when we're all tucked up indoors. And many of those animals would have been doing us a good turn my disposing of garden pests such as slugs and harmful insect larvae. I guess what I'm trying to say is please turn off your outdoor lights when you don't need them – it is so good for wildlife and your garden to leave nature to do its thing. I'd also add that light pollution can equally upset neighbours that might be trying to enjoy the night sky - my yoga buddy Elaine wanted to catch a rare glimpse of the Northern Lights recently, but there was so much unwanted light haze around the village that she had to go out to Approach Road to enjoy the sight.

On a slightly related note, I'd like to reiterate Jon's wise words from last month about leaving seed heads on plants because they are such an essential food source for our birds and other small wildlife. I'll be following this advice although my sunflowers are a bit too tall to leave standing so I'll be hanging the seed heads in the shelter of a tree where the birds can munch away at their leisure.

**Interesting fact of the month.** We have an amazing 9,000+ wild animal species in the UK. And the only creatures that hibernate are hedgehogs, bats and dormice. Which means that there's a lot of hungry mouths to feed outdoors over winter, but light pollution badly disrupts their ability to forage. So, if you turn an outdoor light off, you might just help make something's life a whole lot easier.

#### THE NIGHT SKY IN TATSFIFLD – NOVEMBER 2024

Venus has been an evening object for some time but has been bumping along the horizon without gaining the height needed to make it instantly recognisable as the "Evening Star". Of course, it's worth remembering that by May next it will have moved to the other side of the Sun ready to be hailed as the "Morning Star".

At the beginning of November, 5pm is a good time to look low down and close to the south west to catch Venus when it will be just 7° high. The Sun will be 5° below the horizon then. As the month progresses, Venus gains very gradually in altitude and moves more towards the SSW. By mid- month it is 9° high (around 4:40pm) and by month's end it is nearly 13° in altitude in the SSW at 4:25pm. It will remain a brilliant evening object for us into March 2025 when it will return to the morning sky.

That favourite of telescopic observers, Saturn, is visible as soon as the sky is dark lying due south at 8pm early in the month and around 6:30pm by the end. The issue for Saturn is that it looks very much like a run-of-the-mill star without the brilliance of Venus or the other "gas giant", Jupiter. If you do have the chance to look at Saturn through a telescope you may recall what I said back in July when talking about its ring system. If you look now, the rings will appear to be quite narrow which is the precursor to the "ring plane crossing" that we will experience next March as the Earth passes through the plane of the rings and for a while they will seem to disappear.

Jupiter is also making its presence felt, rising in the early evening as it brightens towards early December when it and the Earth will be at their closest for the year. This is called "opposition" when Jupiter, the Earth and the Sun are all in a line with the Earth in the middle. Jupiter will be at its brightest and largest so this is an ideal time to look for it at a sociable time of night.

Mars is also getting in on the act although it rises a little later than Jupiter, around 9:15pm on the first of November. The red planet is approaching opposition so it is also brightening considerably.



This time of the year sees the welcome return of the striking winter constellations whose brilliance is in sharp contrast to the somewhat muted spring groups. We see the hunter, Orion, and his retinue of two dogs, some twins, a bull and a charioteer. Actually, there's also a hare and a unicorn but they're not nearly so bright. The diagram indicates the constellations in capitals and the brightest stars in italics.

#### **NIGEL'S NATURE NOTES**



We have a (welcome) backlog of news! Consequently, this is 'catchup month', and we begin with this email from Sandy (Philibert), received way back in June:

(25.06.24) 'We know they are not rare but we have a **Wren**'s nest with four eggs, three of which have hatched, in our pot stack probably only about a metre above ground.'

Excellent news, Sandy - lucky you!

Let's hope you managed to keep the cats away. Like yourself, I find all garden birds to be of equal interest and value, regardless of where they may be placed on the scarcity scale. I've got a sideway piled up with pots but sadly, no Wrens. Perhaps if I leave them there long enough I'll get a friendly nester. A Robin, perhaps? Or maybe a passing toad will take up residence? Whatever the outcome, you have provided further evidence that a little 'untidiness' in the garden can be beneficial to visiting wildlife. Good job!

Two of our regular contributors submitted reports in early July regarding a rather bold



bird of prey. First up was Sarah (Andrews):

(03.07.24) 'Spotted this sitting upon a neighbour's fence. Can you please identify it? We thought Sparrow Hawk or Peregrine Falcon, or perhaps a Kestrel?'

WOW - Great photo, Sarah! This is a **Sparrowhawk**. Most birds of prey have the streaks on their chest running vertically, but the Sparrowhawk has them running horizontally. I'm guessing either you or your neighbour have a bird feeder nearby. These birds aren't as nice as they look. If you find a pile of feathers on the ground you know the Sparrowhawk's been busy feeding on something other than nuts and seeds!

Soon afterwards, as if to confirm my somewhat damning observation, John (Rosenbaum) sent two

emails regarding garden visits on the other side of the village:

(06.07.24) 'You may be interested in an incident on our lawn today: A Sparrowhawk liked the look of a Stock Dove for its dinner, and spent the afternoon devouring it.'

(09.07.24) 'Our local Sparrowhawk must like the Cuisine at the 'Pineview Bird Table' as

it was back to dine on Rock Dove/Ferrell Pigeon today.'

I think you'd better start putting up warning signs, John!

Next was Peter (Kerry) who sent this exciting butterfly news:

(02.09.24): 'Just to let you know, I saw a **Brown Hairstreak** on a hazel leaf in my hedge the week before last. I have never seen one before and was



amazed at how beautiful it was. It sat there with its wings closed, but when I reached for my camera it flew off. I'm on holiday for the next two weeks, but feel free to look in my hedge if you wish.'

Thanks for your message, Peter. I did have a nose around when the sun next appeared but, alas, found nothing. I passed your message on to Jim (Yeeles) who, as expected, was delighted to hear of a hairstreak being spotted in this part of the village (Greenway). This was his reply:

(03.09.24) 'Very welcome news, Nigel, and suggests that this is one species that seems to be bucking the trend. Thanks for letting me know. We've also started seeing a few over on the reserve in various locations - that Hemp Agrimony bush is proving fairly reliable again this year but it is has almost gone to seed and won't be so attractive soon.

In my mind's eye I see a bright November day and our intrepid 'Nature Notes' reporter, armed with his trusty hand lens, diligently searching the Greenway Blackthorn bushes for his first Brown Hairstreak egg - Bon chance!'

'Bon chance' indeed, Jim. When I have a spare day and a half I'll give it a try!

And finally, moving on to October, we had a caterpillar message from Amber (Tamcken):

(03.10.24) 'While looking out in the garden we found a spectacular little beastie which I believe is an **Elephant hawk-moth** caterpillar. I'm hoping he will continue to call our garden home so we can watch him grow!'

There seem to be quite a lot of these around this year, Amber. Yours seems a little late so it may not grow any larger but it will, hopefully, transform into something wonderful!


### TATSFIELD'S HISTORY



Last month I reported that 100 years ago there was talk of a search for land for more housing in Tatsfield. As a result, in November 1924, Godstone Rural District Council announced plans in the local press to build 200 houses in the district over the next two years. Of these, ten would be in Tatsfield. The council

had been considering the idea of tenants having the option of becoming the owners of the properties, an idea pioneered by a neighbouring council – Caterham. It was reckoned that the cost of each house would be roughly £525. The tenant would put down £10 and then pay up to 15 shillings (75p) a week 'and after 20 years the house would be his'. Over half a century later came the watershed 'Right to Buy' scheme of the Housing Act 1980.

In October's magazine I also referred to concerns about traffic speeds in Tatsfield. In November 1924, the parish council was told that speed traps had been seen in Godstone and Oxted recently and there was a call for checks to take place in Tatsfield too. Life was "just as valuable at Tatsfield as at other places", said one councillor, who claimed hefty fines had recently been imposed in Oxted.



Finally, a reminder: the next History Weekend is due to take place at the Aileen McHugo Building on November 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>. The main theme of the weekend will be the history of your house. Extracts from the *Inland Revenue* 1910 Rate Assessment Books from the National Archives in Kew will be available. They record how each individual property was assessed for the equivalent of today's Council Tax in the years before the First World War.

The 1911 census recorded 826 people living in 187 dwellings and Tatsfield was

therefore nowhere near as built-up as it is now. Nevertheless, many of you live where properties had already been built. Many of the entries in the assessment books also contain notes commenting on the condition of properties or their suitability for renting. If you do live where you know there was a house all those years ago, just email me at the address below and I will try to ensure that the relevant entry will be available over that weekend **between midday and 5 pm on each day**.

**Behind the Scenes at the National Gallery** by Sian Walters.

In 2024 the National Gallery celebrates its 200th birthday. In the run up to this special anniversary, join Sian as she explores some of the nation's best-loved paintings in a new light, revealing details which cannot be seen with the naked eye and discussing what goes on behind the scenes in the conservation, framing and scientific departments. The lecture will result in a greater understanding of not only the art itself, but also of the work the National Gallery does to care for it, present it and interpret it.

Few of the gallery's works retain their original frames but an expert team will often source and adapt examples which complement the paintings historically, or indeed hand-carve new ones from scratch. We will also look at the technical challenges involved in hanging, displaying, moving and framing the collection and the various solutions devised by the Art Handling Team. Many of the paintings in the gallery were designed for a very specific function, an altarpiece such as Piero's *Baptism of Christ* for example, so how do the curators allow us to interpret and view these within a museum context? Finally, we will talk about restoration and conservation, exploring extraordinary details from works such as the Wilton Diptych, which have only been discovered recently thanks to scientific analysis.

In 2010, the elaborately carved, incomplete oak bed frame was removed from the honeymoon suite of a hotel in Chester, to be auctioned as a Victorian relic. The speaker has spent six years studying and attributing it, now featured in press around the world. Featuring five

royal arms, six single roses, and deeply esoteric symbols of fertility, it turns out to be covered in medieval paintwork, and its proportions respect the mural of the lost Painted Chamber of royal Westminster Palace abandoned in 1512. Scientific analyses, documentation and art history agree to demonstrate it is an astonishing national treasure: the marriage bed of Henry VII and Elizabeth of York, made by 18 January 1486.
